Special Meeting: There was a special meeting on Thursday, April 24 to set a public hearing on May 12th for a CUP Application . The application is for an indoor Cannabis growing facility in the vacant school property.

Council Briefs:

4/14/2025

Guests: Andy Brown – Nicollet County Assessor’s office, Doug Hanson – Winthrop Publications, Residents Jessica Tauber – 551 5th Street, Alisha Brown – 511 Pioneer, Lauren Morson & Nick Morson – 791 5th Street, Nick Klingler – Fire Chief, Mark Dick – Ambulance President, Thomas Stang - Pura Properties and Glenn Hauser – Brickside Growers.

LBA&E Hearing: There were two property owners who appealed their valuations. Pura Properties, the Manor apartments, who had a 40 % increase and K. Baldwin, who felt with the issues there, it should be valued less. An appraiser had been there but no information was available for the council meeting. Council approved changing the Pura Properties to \$586,500, which is a 20% increase. Council approved a no change for the other property and the appeal will go to the county. This will allow the appraiser to submit a proposed valuation for the county hearing in June.

Approved: Agenda and Consent Agenda including the 3/10 minutes, bills totaling \$82,404.26, the receipts totaling \$79,797.39. The treasurer’s report including the bank reconciliation for March, the 2025 payrolls 6, 7 and Resolution 2025-10 - April Donations totaling \$15,100; including; \$10,000 from the Lions for the equipment bond, \$400 Citizens, \$200 Laurie Larson, Xcel Energy to sponsor 125th Celebration events, and a \$4,000 grant from the Carl & Verna Schmidt Foundation for the update of the Lafayette History Book for the 125th celebration.

Reports: Fox: submitted his report and highlighted the street sweeper was purchased and the new brooms have arrived, they will start working on the streets. Council approved the community center floor quote from Service Master for \$2,795 and the purchase of a part for the composite sampler at the WWTF for \$1411.00 plus shipping.

Tauber: He and Fox met again with the rural fire.

Burger: Submitted her report and updated the council on utility billing, 125th committee events, zoning map updated, researched the exercise equipment at the school for when they will be removed and installed the park.

Klingler: Rural agreement, Ham dinner sold out, ISO was good, he has a few timed items to turn in, with results in 2-3 months. Was advised the city pumper to go on reserve and if it doesn’t affect the ISO rating it doesn’t pay to keep it.

Dick: Ordered a new Stryker cot & Lucas III and a power stair chair, using the one-time state funds. They were hoping to save the funds for a new ambulance in 3 or so years, but the State funding needed to be used by the end of 2025 or returned.

Unfinished Business: RO: Waiting on bonding bill. **Stormwater Grant:** Waiting on final report. **STREAMS:** Met again with MPCA to review the permitting requirements of the new facility.

New Business: Approved: Pheasant Forever’s LG2200 State permit for gun bingo. 2025 Ambulance officers, President Dick, VP Uhde, Secretary Griebel, Data Reporting & Active 911 Beranek, Maintenance & Supplies, C Goblirsh, Infectious controls Compton. Still need to fill the training position. Community Center quarterly cleaning to L&L Handyman & Cleaning for \$563.17 based on 10 hours cleaning plus drive time and mileage. Rural Fire & City Fire agreement. Joining MN Small Cities group. Chicken ordinance was discussed and the Mayor called a workshop set for Wednesday May 7, to discuss and create an ordinance before bringing it back to the council for a decision. Discussed remote meeting needs and laws. Will borrow the Winthrop Owl (microphone/camera equipment) for the workshop to see how it works before purchasing equipment.

The next meeting will be a workshop on Wednesday, May 7 to review a possible chicken ordinance and the next regular meeting will be held Monday, May 12 , 2025, at 7:00 pm in the council chambers 791 Main Avenue.
